

Poster Presentation Guidelines for CSS 2011

- **Registration:**
 - Registration and breakfast is from 9:00am to 9:55am in front of Matherly Hall on UF Campus. Please make sure to register before you present. If you cannot make it to morning registration, please stop by the registration table and register before your presentation. Registration is open all day.

- **Presentation:**
 - Please arrive *at least* 15 minutes before your scheduled presentation.
 - You are required to **stand by your poster**, making yourself available to explain your work, answer questions and/or receive feedback during the time of your sub-session
 - Presenters are expected to dress professionally and conduct themselves in a professional manner.

- **Suggested presentation outline:**
 - Your poster should not exceed 48 x 36 inches.
 - These are typical sections found in professional poster presentations:
 - Background of the study
 - Research Questions
 - Methodology
 - Literature Review
 - Results and Discussion
 - Conclusions or Implications
 - To make your poster visually pleasing and easy to read, please **do not overload it** with information. The use of bulleted points, graphs & charts (not too many) can help to streamline your poster.
